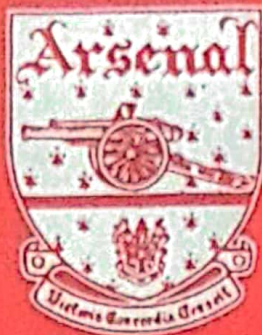

VOICE OF ARSENAL

ONCE again it is our pleasing duty to extend a hearty welcome to our friends from Israel—the Hapoel Football Team from Tel Aviv.

It is now six years, almost to the day that they came here to open the floodlight programme at Highbury in its first season. Although we finished the game victors by 6-1 the Tel Aviv team showed that they were a very useful young team. Holton, who was then playing at centre-forward, got two of the goals, Arthur Milton one, and Reg Lewis got two in the second half, coming on after the interval in place of Lishman.

There are twenty players in the party, four of whom were in the 1951 party. They are Chodorov, Bluth and the two Glazers. In addition we have Mr. A. Avni, one of the founders of the club who has been active for the last thirty years. Also in the party are Mr. J. Lilian and Mr. S. Beck Secretary and Treasurer respectively of the club, Mr. S. Matzov, a Committee member and Dr. Zoundel, the Medical Officer to the Football Section for many years.

Last but not least is Mr. I. Yazbentchik who is the club trainer and trainer to the Israel national team. He used to be a Yugoslavian International (44 times) and is the ex-coach of Dynamo (Zagreb). To them all we extend the heartiest of good wishes.

To-night the band will play both National Anthems although, as a general rule, Anthems are not played before matches between clubs. However, as Israel is a comparatively new State we felt sure that their supporters in England would welcome the opportunity of hearing the Israeli Anthem once again.

HAPOEL PLAYERS

J. CHODOROV. (Goalkeeper). Israel's national goalkeeper for past seven years. Played here in 1951. Occupation—transport manager.

A. BENDORI. (Goalkeeper). Has also played for Israel's national team. A fine goalkeeper. Occupation—bus driver.

A. LEVOCOVITC. (Right-back). He is equally good at centre-half although only just out of his teens. He is a member of the Israeli Armed Forces.

S. TCINOVITZ. (Left-back). Another member of the Israeli Armed Forces he is only 19 years of age.

J. MORDKOBITZ. (Centre-half). Israel's national centre-half and a very useful player. His occupation is ambulance driver.

A. BLUTH. (Right-half). The regular Israel right-half in the national team for the past six years, in fact, since he was 19. Occupation, driver.

B. GOLDSTEIN. (Left-half). Another youngster of 21 who is showing much promise. He is a cooling system mechanic.

U. KVATAIK. (Half-back). One of the reserve half-backs who is only 18 years of age. He too, is in the Israeli Armed Forces.

H. CHOUJBEKO. (Half-back). Another of the reserve half-backs whose occupation is that of mechanic.

H. GLAZER. (Outside-right). There were two "Glazer's" in the 1951 party and they come again. This Glazer is a gas company mechanic.

J. GLAZER. (Centre-forward). A veteran of 29 he has played for the Israel team for the past nine years. He is a bus driver by occupation.

I. MENACHEM. (Outside-right). Menachem is the reserve outside-right and, at 17, he is the youngest player in the party. He is still a student.

A. MENTZEL. (Inside-right). Although only 21 he came into the Israel national team last year and did well. He is a driver by occupation.

J. GOLDSTEIN. (Inside-right). This lad is only 17½ years old and has just finished High School. He is the reserve inside-right.

R. ROSENBAUM. (Inside-left). The regular inside-left, he has played for the national team in that position for three years. His occupation is that of a blacksmith.

P. YEHOUDAIJOFF. (Inside-left). The reserve inside-left of the team, age 19. He is a member of the Israeli Armed Forces.

M. MICHALLEV. (Outside-left). He is a 20 year-old who has shown much promise. Another driver by occupation.

M. FIMAN. (Full-back). A reserve full-back of 22 years of age. Occupation—driver.

G. TICH. (Outside-left). The reserve outside-left, he is only 17 years of age. He is a mechanic by occupation.
